



From Stuck to Success

#1 - Feeling Stuck Online

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“I don’t even know where to begin with making money online... every path feels like a dead end already.”

Burn the Blueprint and Make Your Own

Here's something nobody tells you: the path you carve might not look like anyone else's. And that's a good thing.

The blog you start today might evolve into a YouTube channel next year. The affiliate site you build might morph into a product business. You might find out that you *love* teaching, or that you're better at crafting simple solutions for others than selling high-ticket stuff.

You're not supposed to know all that now.

But you *are* supposed to give yourself permission to try.

There's this dangerous belief that floats around in the online world: that you have to have it all figured out before you launch.

Forget that.

Launch messy. Start small. Be awkward and uncertain and wonderfully human.

Because here's the quiet truth: nobody knows what they're doing in the beginning. Not one person.

Those gurus with big followings? They bombed their first launches. They scrapped entire websites. They changed niches three times. The only difference is... they *kept walking*.

You can too.

Build a Bias Toward Action

At some point, we have to stop researching and start *doing*.

Pick a basic path. Here's a simple one, just as an example:

1. Choose a topic you care about (or are willing to explore for 6 months).
2. Start a simple blog or newsletter.
3. Share helpful stuff once a week — your thoughts, your progress, things you learn.
4. Recommend tools, products, or courses you genuinely like (hello, affiliate marketing).
5. Build trust. Keep showing up. Get better. Pivot if you must.

That's it.

Is it the perfect plan? Nope. But it's a path. A real one. With dirt under your feet and a horizon you can walk toward.

And that's what you've been missing — *movement*.

Not more PDFs. Not more free masterclasses. Not another guru's funnel map.

Just action. Real, imperfect, wobbly action.

 3. What specific outcome can I help them achieve?
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✔ CHALLENGE 3: Build Your First Tiny Asset

What you'll do:

Create one simple piece of value for your future audience — a checklist, mini-guide, cheat sheet, or even a one-page PDF.

Why it works:

Creating something — *anything* — transforms you from consumer to creator. It gives you confidence, builds momentum, and creates something real you can offer or promote.

Your task:

Using a free tool like Canva or Google Docs, build a 1-page checklist or quick-start guide related to your niche. Don't overthink it. Done is better than perfect.

✔ CHALLENGE 4: Publish Something Publicly

What you'll do:

Post one piece of content — a tweet, a Facebook post, a blog, or even a comment — publicly sharing your mission, insight, or offer.

Why it works:

Publishing is terrifying at first, but it's the bridge between lurking and leading. When you put something *out there*, you start attracting people, building confidence, and taking yourself seriously.

Your task:

Write a short post about:

- What you're working on
- Why it matters to you
- How others can benefit

Then hit "Post." Scary? Yes. Worth it? Every time.

✓ CHALLENGE 5: Map Your Next 7 Days

What you'll do:

Take 15 minutes to plan the *next week* of your journey — not the next year. Just seven days of action steps to maintain momentum.

Why it works:

Most people plan too far ahead and burn out before they begin. A micro-plan gives you clarity without pressure. It keeps your momentum alive and builds confidence through daily wins.

Your task:

List 5–7 small actions for the next 7 days — things like:

- Write one email
- Watch one tutorial
- Improve your lead magnet
- Publish one short form post
- Reach out to one person for feedback

Here's the truth:

You don't need to master funnels, launch a full website, or become a marketing genius overnight.

You just need to do *one thing* right now — something simple, focused, and doable that builds momentum.
